
# WARNING

- Before using, clear area of power cords, pull cords for curtains or blinds, clothing and fragile items.







# How to identify parts of your vacuum cleaner



#### **Buttons on Robot**

Press power button for 3 seconds to turn robot on.

When robot is on, the power button will be lit up in white.

When the robot is on, to start the robot cleaning, press the power button for 1 second.

When the robot is running press the power button for 1 second to pause it.

To fully turn off the power, press and hold the power button for 10 seconds. A red light will blink by the home icon on the robot and the power button will no longer be illuminated white.


## **WARNING**

Before running the robot, clear area of power cords. pull cords for curtains or blinds, clothing and fragile items.

## **Easy Assembly**




1. Install the side brush before use Turn robot over and locate circle on upper left side, align the small circle of the spinner brush post in the center of the spinning brush and push until it clicks in place.



2. HEPA filter installation

Robot comes with HFPA filter installed Before use ensure the HEPA filter is securely in place. Remove dust cup from robot, pull up lid of dust cup and make sure HEPA filter is snapped into place. Ensure dust cup lid and bottom latch are securely closed and replace dust cup onto robot.

## Charging



- 1. Place the back of the dock flush against a wall and ensure there are at least 3 feet of free space along the wall on either side of the dock, so the robot is not blocked.
- 2. Connect the charger into the port on the lower right side of the dock and plug the other end of the charger into the wall.

#### NOTE

When the battery power reaches less than 20% the robot will shut off the suction power and automatically return to the charging dock. The robot may occasionally back up off the charger and then go forward back onto charger to realign itself if a better connection is needed with the metal charging contacts.

Please note the robot will arrive with a partially charged battery. If you start using it before fully charging the battery, the cleaning cycle will be shorter than normal as it will return to the dock to recharge when it reaches 20% battery power.



- **3.** Place robot on charger and ensure that the metal charging contacts on the bottom of the robot and those on the dock are touching. When the robot is correctly lined it will make an audible beep and the power button on the robot will light up.
- **4.** The white light on and around the power button will blink while the robot is charging and will turn to a solid white light once the robot is fully charged.
- **5.** Before initial use fully charge the robot for at least 4 hours.

#### To effectively extend the battery life, you should:

- a. For the first use, please charge for 4 hours
- b. When the battery is low, please charge as soon as possible
- c. If you do not use the appliance for an extended period of time, fully charge the battery and store in a well ventilated and dry place
- d. If the appliance is not used for more than 3 months, charge the appliance for 12 hours

#### How to Use Robotic Vacuum Cleaner

**Note:** The robot must be initially turned on to operate in any of the four control methods. To turn robot on, press power button  $\circlearrowleft$  on top of the robot for 3 seconds to turn on until you hear a beep and the power symbol is illuminated in white.

Once the robot is turned on, indicated by the power button lit up in white, you can use either the power button on the robot, the remote control or the app to run the robot.

1. To turn robot on, press power button  $\Theta$  for 3 seconds to turn on until you hear a beep and the power symbol is illuminated in white



If you want to run the robot using the on unit power button:

- Press power button on robot to start the robot.
   Press power button on robot to stop the robot.
- Robot will automatically run until the battery reaches 20% charge, this will be indicated by a flashing red light to the left of the power button on the robot. It will automatically stop its suction power and will go back to the charging dock on its own.
- While the robot is on the dock it will remain powered on. If you want to fully power the robot down press the power button on the robot for 10 seconds, release and the robot will turn off


# Using remote

Ensure that the robot is turned on by pressing and holding the power button  $\circ$ 0 on the robot for 3 seconds to turn on until you hear a beep and the power symbol is illuminated in white.

- Press the start/stop button on remote to start the robot. Press start/stop button on remote to stop or pause the robot.
- Robot will automatically run until its battery gets low, this will be indicated by a flashing red light to the left of the power button on the robot. It will automatically stop its suction power and will go back to the charging dock on its own.
- If you would like the robot to finish cleaning earlier, you can press the home button on the remote and the robot will stop its suction power and go back to the charging dock where it will automatically begin charging.
- 4. While the robot is on the dock it will stay turned on. If you want to fully power the robot down press the power button on the robot for 10 seconds, release and the robot will turn off.

#### Return to Dock

 Press Home/Return to Dock button and robot's suction will power down and it will navigate itself back to the charging dock and automatically begin charging.

#### Cleaning Mode and Suction Intensity

 Press the different cleaning mode icon buttons to change cleaning modes.

**Spot Cleaning Mode:** Robot will repeatedly turn in a tight square to focus on one spot.

**Edge Cleaning Mode:** Robot will clean along the edges of the room.

**Auto Cleaning Mode:** Robot will clean the room normally, not a specific pattern.

2. The Suction Intensity button can increase or decrease the suction manually.

## Setting Up App and Connecting to Wi-Fi

#### NOTE

- App supports iOS 7.0 and above. Android 4.4 and above phone system versions, the app is not available for use with tablets
- This model does not support a WEP encrypted router.
- The home Wi-Fi name and password must be English, numbers or symbols.
- The network accessing configuration of the robot requires a Wi-Fi network of 2.4GHz frequency range, it will not work with a 5GHz frequency range.
- During initial set up, do not connect the robot to Wi-Fi while the robot is charging, the robot must be fully charged to successfully connect to Wi-Fi.
- You must have Wi-Fi in order to control the robot using the app. Once you have set up the app and connect the Wi-Fi, App may be operated in
- Wi-Fi/2G/3G/4G network environment and you can control the robot remotely.
- If your home Wi-Fi password is changed or the router is replaced, the robot will show as offline on the app, you will just need to reconnect the robot to the Wi-Fi following the Wi-Fi connecting instructions.

- 1. In the App Store or Google Play, search for Eureka Robot, download and install the app.
- 2. Open the Eureka app and complete the registration process, which includes an email address confirmation, and once you have confirmed your email address you can log in and follow the setup instructions in the app.
- 3. Connect your phone to your home Wi-Fi network.
- 4. In the app select Add Devices and choose Groove Robot NER300
- 5. On the robot, press the button that savs "Press for Brush Roll" and remove cover, on the far right side find the small gray button and press for a few seconds until you hear a ding and the light by the Wi-Fi symbol on the top of the robot lights up, which will indicate that the Wi-Fi has been successfully connected.

## **Using Eureka Robot App**

The robot can be controlled using the Eureka Robot app from anywhere when the robot is connected to Wi-Fi. See Connecting to Wi-Fi instructions to connect to Wi-Fi and complete Eureka robot app installation and registration.



On the app's home screen, select the Groove Robot NER300



On the next screen you will be able to use the buttons to start/stop cleaning, change modes, adjust suction power. recharge, direct and schedule the robot.



To schedule the robot, click the Schedule button and you can add multiple cleaning schedules, select specific days and times. as well as the type of cleaning mode and suction power you would like to use.

# Using Amazon Echo or Google Home

- 2. Select 'Skills & Games' and search for Eureka Robot and select
- Enable the Eureka robot skill
- 4. Your Eureka robot app will then open and you will login using your Eureka robot app credentials
- 5. The Eureka robot skill and the app should now be successfully linked, and this will be indicated on the Amazon Alexa app.
- 6. You can now use the following commands to control the robot:
- "Alexa, tell Eureka robot to start cleaning"
- "Alexa, tell Eureka robot to stop cleaning"
- "Alexa, tell Eureka robot to go home"

#### Google Home

- 2. Search for Eureka robot and select

- "Ask Eureka robot to go home"

# How to maintain your vacuum cleaner

Regularly use a dry cloth to remove dust and debris from cliff sensors. charging contacts and sensors on front bumper to ensure they are not blocked.

# **CAUTION**

Never operate vacuum cleaner without all filters. filter screen and dust cup in proper position.

**WARNING:** Moving parts! Recharge cleaner after each use.

### Dust cup - Empty after each use



1. Press dust cup release button to remove dust cup from robot.



- 2. Hold dust cup over trash can and press the easy empty release button.
- 3. Thoroughly clean dust cup. Lid can also be opened from top to remove additional debris that may be stuck.



4. Open lid to access and remove HEPA filter and shake to remove dust. Replace HEPA filter ensuring that dust and debris doesn't fall into the opening behind the filter, and then push filter edges to ensure it clicks back into place.



5. Close top and bottom lid until they both click in to place and place the dust cup back on the robot until it clicks into place.

# How to maintain brushroll


To avoid unnecessary service calls, periodically check brushroll for debris. If brushroll gets clogged it will automatically shut off. Turn vacuum off before attempting to remove clog.

## Washable brushroll - clean frequently

# CAUTION

Make sure vacuum cleaner is turned off and not plugged into a power source.

WARNING: Do not attempt to remove belt. Call the Eureka Customer Service HELPLINE at 1-800-282-2886.





3. Replace brush roll and push down to ensure it is correctly in place with the red tipped end of the brush on the left side. Replace lid and push down until it clicks.

Note: If spinning brush is curled, you can remove it and place in warm water for 30 seconds and then let it thoroughly dry. Also regularly use the brush cleaner to remove dust, debris and hair from the spinning brush. Brushroll frame can also be removed and cleaned but lifting out. When putting back in ensure the side with rubber flap is on the side closest to the dust bin.



1. Press brush roll release button on top of robot and lift center unit out.



Every three months, rinse and dry the brush roll, spinner brush and HEPA filter then dry thoroughly for at least 24 hours.

# **Problem solving**



Make sure vacuum cleaner is off and charging plug is unplugged.

## NOTICE: Thermal cut-off

This vacuum cleaner has a special thermostat that protects the vacuum cleaner in case of motor overheating. If the vacuum suddenly shuts off, proceed as follows: 1) Check the vacuum for a possible source of overheating such as a full dust cup, tangled brushroll or clogged filters. If these conditions are found, fix them and wait at least 30 minutes before attempting to use the vacuum. 2) After the 30 minute period, press the power button.
